What is ALS?


Aided Language Stimulation (ALS) is a way to model language using symbols alongside talking.

Why are we using ALS?

- To develop an understanding of words and symbols.
- To model another way of communicating.

How to introduce ALS

- Choose a motivating activity for your child.
- Make a board with key language and relevant symbols on it. This could be phrases or words dependent on your child.
- When playing with the activity model language by pointing to the symbol when saying the words, for example 'bubbles', 'pop bubble'.
